Aiming for Ivy League, Hanna Johnson Hits the Bullseye>>>

Tenacity and grit are qualities that define people in rural North Dakota communities. For Richland #44 senior Hanna Johnson, those same traits helped her collect an impressive list of college acceptance letters, to include three Ivy League institutions – Harvard, Columbia, and Cornell. Through many months of demanding work, rigorous application processes, and wondering if a North Dakota farm girl like herself could make the cut, Johnson is one enormous step closer to her dreams.

“If the financial aid is what I need it to be, I am 100% going to Harvard,” says Johnson. The highly organized and motivated senior says she plans to pursue a government concentration with a secondary concentration in English or psychology, with an additional focus on business to prepare herself for law school and a master’s degree in public policy. Johnson hopes her future as a lawyer will evolve into an opportunity to run for political office.

Her keen interest in politics was one of Johnson’s motivators to apply for the United States Senate Youth Program, for which she was selected in 2019. Johnson spent a week in Washington D.C. with 103 other U.S. students in the highly selective program, earning the opportunity to dive into government policy, meet President Trump, and connect with her North Dakota Senators. She also received a \$10,000 college scholarship as part of her appointment to the USSYP.

Johnson attended the Harvard Summer Program in 2018, an experience that ignited her passion for the East Coast and a Harvard education. From the individualized attention she received from her professors, the intense academic rigor, and the scenic campus and surrounding community, she knew it’s where she belonged. “I never thought it was attainable for someone like me, coming from rural North Dakota. Harvard has been my dream school since my sophomore year and since then, I’ve made so many connections to other North Dakota students who’ve pursued elite universities,” says Johnson.

Regarding the current school closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Johnson says, “School looks and feels different now, but its purpose remains the same. I wonder if that last Friday at school will be my last day (physically) at Richland. I really wanted the opportunity to say goodbye to my classmates and teachers in-person, and I feel like we are missing the quintessential senior moments we were so looking forward to.” She is expecting college orientations to look different now, expecting that many colleges will be offering virtual-orientations due to health concerns. “I am so grateful I had the opportunity to experience Harvard in person. This year’s incoming freshmen will not have that chance before they commit or start.”



Summer Food Program Offered at Richland #44 >>>

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a federally-funded, state-administered program. SFSP reimburses providers who serve free healthy meals to children and teens in low-income areas during the summer months when school is not in session.

Due to COVID-19, all schools now qualify for this program. Richland #44 School District has submitted the application and is offering this program to families. Breakfast and lunch meals will be provided Monday-Friday through the remainder of the school year or until school is back in session, whichever comes first.

These meals are provided FREE of charge. All students in our school district qualify, regardless of Free & Reduced status. In order to participate, **you must sign up to receive the meals**. Meals will be prepared for the week and delivered each Tuesday. (Please note: guidelines and details of delivery will be shared once you sign up.) You can sign up at any time and will continue receiving meals until the program ends or we hear from you to cease delivery.


